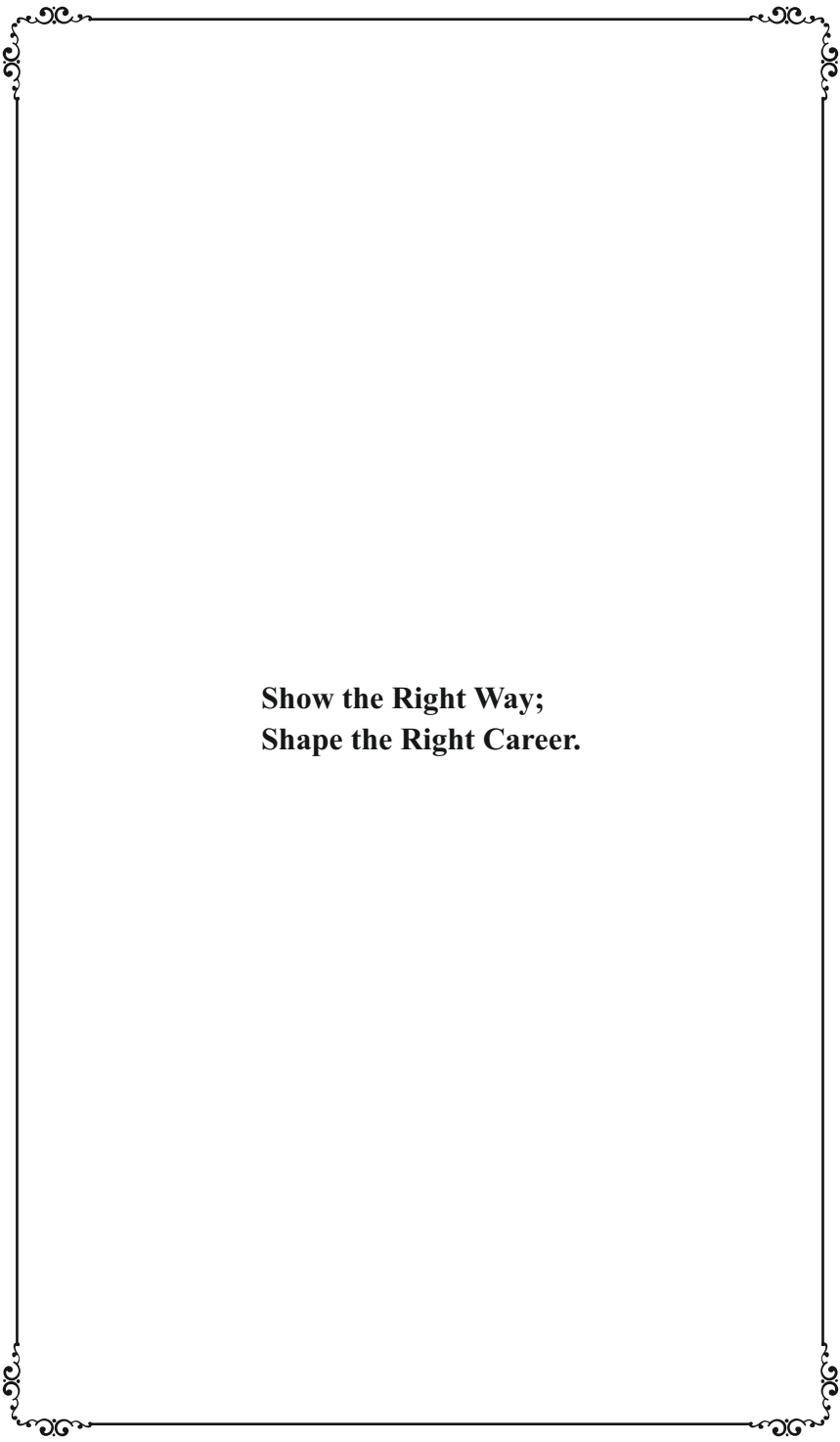

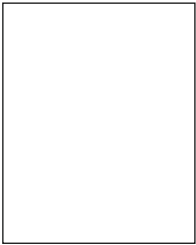

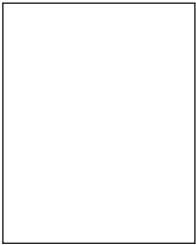

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The diary must be brought on all working days.
2. Children will be motivated to use decent language inside the campus.
3. ***Students must wear uniform on all working days except, on special days like birthday, Onam celebrations and Christmas celebrations.***
4. **Students are expected to bring only vegetarian food to school.**
5. **Any problem faced by a student or parent should first be discussed with the Principal.**
6. **Parents can meet the teachers from 3:30 P.M. to 4:30 P.M, Monday to Friday.**
7. The students should maintain the highest standard of discipline in the campus.
8. No student is allowed to leave school premises during the school hours without the permission of the Principal.
9. Students must cultivate the habit of remaining clean, neat and tidy.
10. No school property should be damaged in any form. Any damage must be reported to the class teacher or the teacher in charge. The damage of any kind shall have to be made good by the concerned student.
11. The students will not bring any materials other than their books without the prior permission of the Principal.
12. Parents are requested not to give money to students while coming to school.

13. Students are prohibited from wearing any kind of valuables or **bringing** any kind of cosmetics to the school. The School will not be held **responsible** for any loss of valuable items.
14. No student will remain absent from school unless forced by illness.
15. The students are directed to behave in an orderly manner during games, lunch time and at intervals.
16. Classrooms are to be kept tidy. Text books, exercise books and note books are to be covered with brown paper. Any damage should be replaced without delay.
17. Students should not disturb other class students during any activity. Any student taking part in or instigating any kind of disturbance in the smooth working of the school will be dismissed forthwith.
18. The value of library books lost or damaged will be recovered from the students.
19. The school reserves the right to dismiss any student, who is a chronic lagger in studies and fails to show progress.
20. Students are expected to be well groomed. They should have well-trimmed finger nails. Boys should come with neat haircut, should wear inner vests and girls must use black ribbons. No fancy hair styles are allowed in the school campus.
21. Parents are prohibited from meeting students or teachers during working hours without prior permission from the Principal.
22. Reports will be sent to the parents time to time, and should be duly signed, taken note of and returned to the school promptly.
23. Parents are expected to co-operate in the working of the school by enforcing regularity, punctuality and discipline by taking daily interest in their child's progress. They should check the diary and note the home work given and see that the assigned work is done by the ward.

24. Remarks entered in the diary of students should be duly responded by the parent.
 25. Parents are requested to come to the school at least once in a month to meet the teachers to discuss and review the performance of their wards.
 26. It is mandatory for all students and teachers to be present on the days of importance, such as Republic Day, Independence Day, Gandhi Jayanthi etc.
 27. Parents are requested not to discuss the affairs of the school in the presence of their wards and complaints can be dealt directly with the school.

National Education Policy 2020 (NEP - 2020)

We are advocating the principles of National Education Policy 2020 from K G to Class 12th which lays particular emphasis on the development of the creative potential of each individual. It is based on the principle that education must develop not only cognitive capacities-both the foundational capacities of literacy and numeracy and higher order cognitive capacity such as critical thinking and problem solving, but also social ethical and emotional dispositions. The New Educational Policy follows a new pedagogical and curricular structure - 5 + 3 +3 +4, 3 years in Pre-School and 12 Years in School.

Curricular and Pedagogical Structure

1. Foundational Stage (5 Years) - 3 years Pre-School + Class I & II.
2. Preparatory Stage (3 Years)- Class III - V
3. Middle Stage (3 Years) - Class VI - VIII
4. Secondary Stage (4 Years) - Class IX - XII

CONTINUOUS & COMPREHENSIVE EVALUATION

Globalisation in every sphere of society have important implications for education. We are witnessing the increasing commercialization of education. We need to be vigilant about the pressure to commodify schools and the application of market related concepts to school quality. The increasingly competitive environment into which schools are being drawn and the aspirations of parents place a tremendous burden of stress and anxiety on children, including the very young to the detriment of their personal growth and development, and thus hamper the joy of learning.

Education aims at making children capable of becoming responsible, productive and useful members of society. Knowledge, skills and attitude are built through learning experiences and opportunities created for learners in school. It is in the class room that learners can analyse and evaluate their experience, learn to doubt, to question, to investigate and to think independently.

The aims of education simultaneously reflect the current needs and aspirations of a society as well as its lasting values and immediate concerns of a community as well as broad human ideals. At any given time and place they can be called the contemporary and contextual articulations of broad and lasting human aspirations and values.

An understanding of learners, educational aims, the nature of knowledge and the nature of the school as a social space can help us arrive at principles to guide classroom practices. Conceptual development is thus a continuous process of deepening and enriching connections and acquiring new layers of meaning. Alongside is the

development of theories that children have about the natural and social world, including themselves in relation to others, which provide them with explanations for why things are the way they are, the relationships between causes and effects, and the basis for decisions and acting. Attitudes, emotions and values are thus an integral part of cognitive, and are linked to the development of language, mental representations, concepts and reasoning.

As children meet with cognitive development, they become more aware of their own beliefs and capable of regulating their own learning.

FEATURES OF CONTINUOUS & COMPREHENSIVE EVALUATION

1. The 'continuous' aspect of CCE takes care of 'continual' and 'periodicity' aspect of evaluation.
2. Continual means assessment during the instructional process (formative evaluation) done informally using multiple techniques of evaluation.
3. Periodicity means assessment of performance done frequently at the end of unit term (summative). The 'comprehensive' component of CCE takes care of assessment of all round development of the child's personality. It includes assessment in scholastic as well as co-curricular, aspects of the pupil's growth.
4. Scholastic aspect includes curricular areas or subject specific areas, whereas co-scholastic aspects include Life skills, Co-curricular, attitudes and values.
5. Assessment in scholastic areas is done informally and formally using multiple techniques of evaluation

continually and periodically. The causes of poor performance in some units are diagnosed using diagnostic tests. These are followed up with appropriate interventions followed by retesting.

6. Assessment in Co-scholastic area is done using multiple techniques on the basis of identified criteria, while assessment in Life Skills is done on the basis of Indicators of Assessment and checklists.

The major emphasis of CCE is one of continuous growth of students ensuring their intellectual, emotional, physical, cultural and social development and therefore it will not be merely limited to assessment of learner's scholastic attainments. It uses assessment as all means of motivating learners in further programmes to provide information for arranging feedback and follow up work to improve upon the learning in the classroom and to present a comprehensive picture of a learner's profile.

EXAMINATION AND PROMOTION NORMS

- ❖ Each student needs to pass the Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation as well as the Summative Examinations with at least 50% marks.
- ❖ Promotion in all classes will be determined by the marks achieved over the year.
- ❖ Four Formative Assessments and two Summative Assessments will be held each year.
- ❖ There are ten parameters for FAs for each subject. The parameters differ for each subject.
- ❖ A weightage of 10% marks is provided for all Assessments and weightage of Term I, Activities for 10% and weightage for final examination 80%. Thus the weightage of marks for a student in an year is as follows:

$A1 + A2 + A3 + A4 + T1 - 10\%, \text{Activities } 10\%,$

$\text{Term II} - 80\% = 100\%.$

- ❖ The final marks of a student absent for a unit test because of illness will be based on the average of the number of tests taken.
- ❖ A student will not be allowed to sit for the annual examination if he/ she has not put in a minimum of 75% of the total attendance during the academic year. A student who fails twice in the annual examination in the same class will not be allowed to continue studies in the school.
- ❖ A student who is absent for both Assessment & Term will not be considered for promotion.

- ❖ In view of the system of unit test and the year's average in determining the eligibility for promotion, it will not be possible to hold retest.
- ❖ Answer sheets of the final assessments will not be returned. All other papers will be returned to the students.
- ❖ Promotion is decided at the teacher's examination board. Hence the results are final and cannot be changed under any circumstances. Parents are requested not to approach the teachers and the management with any such requests.
- ❖ If any student is found using unfair means in any of the examinations his/her exam scripts will be cancelled and further disciplinary action will be taken to curb this malpractices. Similarly disciplinary action will be taken for tampering of marks in the progress report.

PARENT TEACHER INTERACTION

The parent teacher interaction programme is also contributing to the welfare activity and the all-round activities of the school. The school is thankful for their co-operation and help in carrying out activities of the school.

FOR STUDENTS USING BUS SERVICE

1. The bus fees must be paid in the office in advance every month.
